Physician self-care is not emphasized in graduate medical education. How do you deal with the emotional aftermath of the death of a patient or a weighty medical error you made? How do you get past the anger and resentment you feel Michigan when one of your patients unexpectedly sues you? Society's I & II unrealistic expectations of physicians, coupled with our ingrained vulnerabilities of self-neglect and desired perfectionism create a perfect storm for such stressors to produce debilitating physician distress. This plenary will explore ways to manage major stressful events in one's career by sharing personal experiences with life-changing stress and a journey in restoring work-life balance and meaningfulness in our work.
