Physician Heal Thyself: A Primer on Physician Self-Care in the Face of Life-Changing Stress

Physician self-care is not emphasized in graduate medical education. How do you deal with the emotional aftermath of the death of a patient or a weighty medical error you made? How do you get past the anger and resentment you feel when one of your patients unexpectedly sues you?
